Section 14 – Judges

14.1

Judges of the Monroe County Court system will be allowed to carry and possess a firearm within the facility while working, provided the judge passes a County approved qualification course on the use of the firearm issued. Completion of the qualification course must take place prior to the judge being granted access to the facility with a firearm. If the firearm is concealed a CCW permit must also be obtained. The Chief Judge of the respective court must submit the names to the County Administrator of the judges who possess firearms. Additionally, the qualification results of the firearms testing must be submitted showing satisfactory completion of the course.
