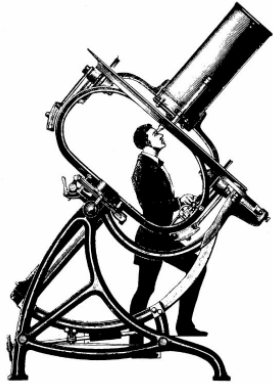

The Native American kits include unique hands-on materials. Primary or Woodland versions.

The Early French Settlers contains 2 Power Point presentations (with text)- one on buildings, customs, clothing, foods, and Monique of Frenchtown, a girl's 1790 life.

The Fur Trade introduces a forgotten economy based on trade in North America. Books, trade items, fur pieces, and games help identify the key participants.

The War of 1812 is highlighted with the Battles of Frenchtown, January of 1813. Filmed with reenactors, this will bring history to life.

The Toledo War features a CD "flip-book" with slides and text on the war.

The Underground Railroad has an educational board game, video, music in CD and cassette form, books and articles on the railroad in Michigan.

The Civil War Soldier is packed with hands-on reproduction articles that helped to form what the common soldier used in camp life. The kit contains books, music, the movie "Gettysburg", music, and offers soldier letters for classroom use.

The Battle of the Little Big Horn contains a flip-book and articles on the 1876 event, and some information on General George A. Custer. Suggested use in connection with a Custer tour at the main Museum.

Grandmother's Trunk is for younger students. Items that are kept from the past are unpacked from several suitcases that were kept in "Grandmother's attic".

The Early Kitchen is a simple assortment of kitchen gadgets used as a guessing game as to their use, with explanations and information. For younger elementary.

The One-Room School comes with all the materials you need to outfit your own period classroom- slates and pencils, texts for all ages, even paper dunce hats.

The Textile & Spinning kit introduces the clothing industry from start to finish. Wool is provided with drop spindles for students to have a hand in learning the pioneer spinning craft. Weaving ideas are included.

The Monroe Architecture kit has a "flip-book" showcasing local building styles, and a local walking tour.

Monroe County Maps feature copies of some of the older maps housed at the main Museum, including the 1810 French Claims drawing, and parts of the 1876 and 1901 plat maps. Includes pages to be photocopied, and transparencies to be used with an overhead project.
