Tickets for the 2009 Monroe County Historical Museum Lantern Tours will be available starting Oct. 1. This year's theme is: "*Down the Crooked Road of Anarchy.*"

The candle light guided tours will take place Oct. 16-17, and Oct. 23-24, at the Navarre-Anderson Trading Post complex, 3775 North Custer Road, Monroe.

Step back in time 200 years to an autumn eve in 1809 Frenchtown, where you are invited to a Harvest Soiree in honor of Michigan Territorial Governor William Hull. You will be filled with anticipation as you journey down the road to your destination. But not all is as it seems this cool, crisp, autumn eve. Discontent permeates the air and spies lurk everywhere. Listen closely and be on your guard for tensions are mounting and you could easily be drawn into the conspiracy.

But just who are the conspirators: the disgruntled road surveyors, the outraged Native Americans, the frustrated local militia, renegades of the Black Militia, the territorial government, or the Frenchtown inhabitants themselves?

Where will your allegiance be or are you part of the anarchy?

Tours start at 7:30 p.m. and each tour lasts approximately an hour. Tickets must be purchased in advance for \$10 a person, ages 12 & under are \$5. The fee includes admission, a tour booklet, cider and doughnuts.
