

City of Monroe

POLICE STATION BOND PROPOSAL

Shall the City of Monroe, Michigan, borrow the principal sum of not to exceed Twelve Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$12,500,000), and issue its unlimited tax general obligation bonds, payable in not to exceed twenty-one (21) years, to pay the cost of acquiring, constructing, furnishing and equipping a police station as an addition to the existing fire station located on E. Third Street creating a public safety facility, including all site improvements? If approved, the estimated millage to be levied in 2023 is 0.98 mills (\$0.98 per \$1,000 of taxable value) and the estimated simple average annual millage rate required to retire the bonds is 0.97 mills (\$0.97 per \$1,000 of taxable value).

Jefferson Schools

JEFFERSON SCHOOLS SINKING FUND MILLAGE RENEWAL PROPOSAL

This proposal will allow the school district to continue to levy the building and site sinking fund millage that expires with the 2022 tax levy.

Shall the currently authorized millage rate of .95 mill (\$0.95 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) which may be assessed against all property in Jefferson Schools, Monroe County, Michigan, be renewed for a period of 10 years, 2023 to 2032, inclusive, to continue to provide for a sinking fund for the construction or repair of school buildings and all other purposes authorized by law; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2023 is approximately \$968,969 (this is a renewal of millage that will expire with the 2022 tax levy)?

Mason Schools

MASON CONSOLIDATED SCHOOLS OPERATING MILLAGE PROPOSAL

This proposal will allow the school district to levy the statutory rate of not to exceed 18 mills on all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, required for the school district to receive its revenue per pupil foundation allowance.

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, in Mason Consolidated Schools, Monroe County, Michigan, be increased by 18.4532 mills (\$18.4532 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 6 years, 2023 to 2028, inclusive, to provide funds for operating purposes (17.9532 mills of the above is a renewal of millage that expires with the 2022 tax levy and .5 mill is to restore millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the "Headlee" amendment of the Michigan Constitution of 1963); the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and 18 mills are levied in 2023 is approximately \$1,390,309?

Bedford Twp

BEDFORD TOWNSHIP, MONROE COUNTY, MICHIGAN

BEDFORD LIBRARY RENEWAL PROPOSAL

Shall the Bedford Library millage, which expires after the tax collections in 2022, be renewed in accordance with the limitations imposed under Article IX, Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution, such that the Township of Bedford shall be authorized to levy .25 mills, which is \$0.25 per \$1,000.00 of taxable value upon the taxable real and tangible personal property within the Township of Bedford, Monroe County, Michigan, as has been previously reduced by the Headlee Amendment to the estimated amount of .2449 mills, for a period of five (5) years beginning with the tax collections in 2023 and continuing through the tax collections in 2027, all inclusive, for the purpose of providing certain funding for the Bedford Township Library for general building and grounds operations and maintenance, and for capital expenditures for building and grounds improvements and replacements? The estimated revenue for the first year of the levy, if the proposition is approved, shall be approximately \$329,217.00.

EXETER TOWNSHIP

RENEWAL MILLAGE FOR ROAD IMPROVEMENTS, REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE

Shall the previous voted increase in the tax limitation of Exeter Township imposed under Article IX Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution, of one and one-quarter (1 .25) mills (\$1 .25 per \$1000 of taxable value) which will expire and last be collected in December of 2022, reduced to one and 1 .21 mills (\$1.21 per \$1000 of taxable value) by the required millage rollbacks, be renewed at up to 125 mills (\$125 per \$1000 of taxable value) for the purpose of funding Township Road Improvements, Repairs and Maintenance;

- to be levied against all taxable property in Exeter Township for a period of five (5) years being years 2023 through 2027 inclusive; which if approved will raise in the first year of levy estimated revenue of \$202,000.

Estral Beach X3

Estral Beach Volunteer Fire Department Millage

Proposition to authorize the Village of Estral Beach to extend the expiring millage and levy a property tax of 2 mills for a total of four (4) years for the purpose of operating and upgrading Fire Rescue Service and Equipment.

Shall the Village of Estral Beach, Monroe County, Michigan, levy a 2-mills property tax and place it on the property tax roll for the years 2023, 2024, 2025, and 2026, which will raise in the first year of such levy an estimated revenue of thirty-four thousand dollars (\$34,000) for the purpose of operating and upgrading fire and rescue services and equipment.

Estral Beach Flood Control Millage

Proposition to authorize the Village of Estral Beach to extend the expiring millage and levy a property tax of 2 mills for a total of four (4) years for the purpose of maintaining and hardening the Village's flood control measures.

Shall the Village of Estral Beach, Monroe County, Michigan, levy a 2-mills property tax and place it on the property tax roll for the years 2023, 2024, 2025, and 2026, which will raise in the first year of such levy an estimated revenue of thirty-four thousand dollars (\$34,000) for the purpose of maintaining and hardening (e.g., install steel walls) of the Village owned flood control measures.

Estral Beach Supplemental Flood Control Millage

Proposition to authorize the Village of Estral Beach to levy a new property tax of 2- mills for a total of four (4) years for the purpose of improving and maintaining Village berms, levees, ditch system, pumps, and other flood control measures as needed.

Shall the Village of Estral Beach, Monroe County, Michigan, levy an additional 2- mills property tax and place it on the property tax roll for the years 2023, 2024, 2025, and 2026 which will raise in the first year of such levy an estimated revenue of thirty-four thousand dollars (\$34,000) for the purpose of improving and maintaining Village berms, levees, ditch system, pumps, and other flood control measures as needed.
